Course hours: 120 hours (20 classes) each class is 5 hours

Course Objectives: Given pertinent information, supported by instructional resources, the student will be capable of performing a variety of related skills. **In** order to demonstrate mastery of these objectives, the student must respond correctly on instructor-revised evaluations, achieving a percentage of accuracy that meets the requirements for academic performance as published in the school catalog

Upon completion of the course, the student will be able to

- .01 demonstrate an ability to give an oral report of the events that occurred during antepartum, intrapartum and postpartum care of clients
- .02 describe in detail (including vital signs and pertinent data) births observed and managed
- .03 demonstrate an ability to participate in peer review including making suggestions, judgements of past clients case histories managed by local midwives participating in peer review
- .04 demonstrate an ability to chart accurately
- .05 demonstrate an ability to understand medical terminology and abbreviations provided during peer review

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Required Text: none

Course Outline: Class 1-20 will consist of the student midwife presenting a written and oral report concerning the birth most recently observed or managed, to the class. This report includes all information that is pertinent and which is charted on the labor, delivery flow chart. This data on the report will be in medical terminology and abbreviations. A brief description of the woman's past obstetrical history will be included and a class discussion will follow each report. Students that have not yet attended births will participate in class discussion at their own level.
